SUBJECT: Resolution authorizing application for a Local Government Waste Tire Amnesty Event Grant

RECOMMENDATION

Local Enforcement Agency Manager requests adoption of a resolution rescinding and replacing Resolution No. 06-43, concerning a waste tire amnesty grant application and authorizing the following:

1. Submittal of an application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for a Local Government Waste Tire Amnesty Event Grant in the amount of \$37,216.57, for Fiscal Year 2005-2006; and
2. Approval of and authorization for the Assistant County Executive Officer to execute the necessary grant documents.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On March 7, 2006, your board approved resolution 06-43, authorizing application to CIWMB for the Waste Tire Amnesty Grant. The Recommendation and Resolution identified the Fiscal Year as 2006-07. The CIWMB required the resolution and grant submittal for 2005-06, the FY CIWMB will award the grant and initiate allocation of funds. If awarded, the LEA will implement and received cost reimbursement in the 2006-07 FY. Approval of the recommended action will satisfy the CIWMB grant submittal requirements. If awarded, the LEA will implement and receive cost reimbursement in the 2006-07 FY.

Discretionary Justification:	Waste Tire Amnesty Grant will provide the LEA resources to perform the grant program and benefit tire businesses in the County.

Future fiscal impact:	The LEA must apply for the grant awards annually. The LEA expects to apply for and receive grant funds in future years. A majority of the grant funds are for material costs, and minimal revenue associated with personnel.
Consequences if not approved:	The LEA would not receive the grant award and would not administer the amnesty events.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On March 7, 2006, your board approved resolution 06-43, authorizing application to CIWMB for the Waste Tire Amnesty Grant. The Recommendation and Resolution identified the Fiscal Year as 2006-07. The CIWMB required the resolution and grant submittal for 2005-06, the FY CIWMB will award the grant and initiate allocation of funds. If awarded, the LEA will implement and received cost reimbursement in the 2006-07 FY. The amended resolution will correctly satisfy the CIWMB grant submittal requirements. If awarded, the LEA will implement and receive cost reimbursement in the 2006-07 FY.

The purpose of the grant is to further provide a means for removal of waste tires from local neighborhoods and promote public education on tire storage, recycling, and health and safety. Although it is currently the Board's Policy to allow the County Executive Office authority to approve submittal of grant applications, the Amnesty Grant application requires a resolution from the applicants governing body authorizing submittal of the application. The County Executive Office will coordinate with the Upper Valley Waste Management Agency and the City of Napa, who have submitted letters of support in this cooperative grant application project. If approved, the County of Napa will administer and execute any agreements or contracts to implement the grant as specified in the grant application.
