### ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

### BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Two of the three community at large positions on the Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC) are currently vacant. The County Executive Office has recruited for these positions for several months and has received only the

application from Mr. Groeneweg.

The EMCC was established on October 8, 1968 by the Board of Supervisors. The current functions of the EMCC are as follows:

- 1. Review, at least annually, all of the following:
  - a. the operations of ambulance services operating within the County of Napa;
  - b. emergency medical care offered within the County of Napa, including programs for training large numbers of people in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and lifesaving first aid techniques; and
  - c. first aid practices within the County of Napa.
- 2. Report to the State Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Authority, the local Emergency Medical Services Agency and the Napa County Board of Supervisors, at least annually, the observations and recommendations of the EMCC resulting from the EMCC's activities listed in (1), above.
- Act in an advisory capacity to the Napa County Board of Supervisors and the local EMS Agency on all matters related to emergency medical services as directed and requested by the Board of Supervisors from time to time.

The EMCC consists of 29 members. Twenty-six (26) of the members serve as exofficio or as designated by and to represent their employing Agencies. These Agencies consist of emergency responders from the County and the Cities including fire and law enforcement officials. County administration and hospitals are also represented. The three remaining members are public members appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

The County Executive Office will continue to recruit for the one remaining public member vacancy.
