CAPC is also mandated by law to recommend and improve services to meet victims' needs.

CAPC has been in existence for over thirty years. Cope Family Center has served as the administrator and lead agency. The Council network consists of over 30 Napa organizations and professionals working to implement and support child abuse prevention programs in our community. The Council is part of a thriving network of CAPCs located in every county of California, supported by the state Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP). The Council is an active member of Prevent Child Abuse California
