(EMS). Three (3) members represent the community at large. The EMCC acts in an advisory capacity to the Napa County Board of Supervisors and the EMS Agency on matters related to emergency medical services.

In accordance with the EMCC's By-laws, the EMCC must provide an annual report to the Board of Supervisors. The report should address specific primary projects, EMS system updates, and regional committee and staffing updates.
