SUBJECT: Budget transfer and establish a fixed asset for replacement vehicles for the Sheriff's Department.

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Public Works requests approval of Budget Transfer No. 72 increasing appropriations in the Equipment Pool budget with offsetting revenue from Equipment Pool Fund Balance and establishment of fixed assets in the amount of \$182,000 for the purchase of six replacement vehicles for the Sheriffs Department. (4/5 vote required)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Budget Transfer No. 72 will appropriate \$182,000 in the Equipment Pool Budget (4030) for the replacement of five fully depreciated vehicles and one totaled vehicle.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Fleet Management has a policy of replacing Sheriff Patrol vehicles and all trucks once they have reached 90,000 miles; all other vehicles depreciation thresholds are established at 80,000 miles. In reviewing the Sheriff's fleet, five vehicles have reached or will reach the end of their useful life before the end of the fiscal year and one patrol vehicle was totaled. Based upon discussions with the Sheriff, Public Works is recommending their replacement now instead of making this request as part of the Recommended Budget for 2005-2006 in order that they don't further exceed these mileage thresholds.

The table below details the specific vehicles to be replaced and replacement models will be bid with similar specifications.
