County Executive Officer requests three reappointments and one new appointment to the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council representing the public.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

There are currently four public member openings on the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) due to expiration of term. The County Executive Office has recruited for the the openings and received the above responses. Felix Bedolla, Carla Dal Porto and Barbara Nemko are seeking reappointment and Tammy Rogers is a new applicant.

The Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 01-02 on January 9, 2001 establishing the JJCC pursuant to Section 749.22 of the California Welfare and Institutions Code. There are sixteen (16) members of the JJCC, four of which are public members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The purpose of the JJCC is as follows:

- a. To advise the Chief Probation Officer in the development of the proposed expenditure plan for funds provided under the Comprehensive Youth Services Act, and to advise the Chief Probation Officer with respect to compliance with all statutory and all state and federal guidelines and regulatory requirements;
- b. To develop and submit to the Board of Supervisors a Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile Justice Plan in accordance with the requirements of the Crime Prevention Act of 2000 and all guidelines and requirements of the State Board of Corrections; and,
- c. To develop methods of monitoring expenditure of funds, to insure quality of services provided, and to evaluate the outcome effectiveness of services and programs funded under the Comprehensive Youth Services Act (Chapter 3.2 of Part 6 of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code) and any other juvenile justice expenditures as the Board of Supervisors may direct.

Both the Chief Probation Officer and the JJCC recommend the appointment/reappointments.
