RECOMMENDATION

Presentation of a proclamation declaring May 14-20, 2006 as Emergency Medical Services Week in Napa County.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) is an essential public safety service. This proclamation recognizes the value and importance of emergency medical services providers by designating May 14-20 as "Emergency Medical Services Week" in Napa County.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) is easily recognized when one sees emergency vehicles or helicopters responding to incidents in the community, but it is, in fact, much more. It is an intricate system of agencies and organizations, communications and transportation networks, and trauma systems as well as hospitals, trauma

centers and specialty care centers, rehabilitation facilities, and highly trained professionals – including volunteer and career pre-hospital personnel, physicians, nurses, therapists, administrators, government officials, and an informed public that knows what to do in a medical emergency. Each component of the EMS system has an essential job to perform as part of a coordinated system of care.

The Napa County EMS Agency is a participant in the tri-county EMS regional system comprised of Napa, Sonoma, and Mendocino Counties. The EMS Agency participates in a cooperative County effort to prepare for disasters and medical emergencies, as well as to provide oversight of the EMS system and processing of certification and accreditation of emergency medical technicians, paramedics, and emergency medical dispatchers.

The Emergency Medical Care Committee, Public Information and Education Committee, and EMS Agency encourage all citizens of our community to become aware of the Napa County EMS System and to help celebrate and recognize National EMS Week May 14-20, 2006. The EMS Week theme is: "EMS: Serving on Health Care's Front Line."
