SUBJECT: Amendment No. 1 to WRECO Professional Services Agreement No. AUD 6967

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Public Works requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign Amendment No. 1 to an agreement (formerly Agreement No. AUD 6967) with WRECO extending the term of the agreement for an additional three (3) years beyond the original term of the agreement for a contract amount of \$150,000 per fiscal year to provide on-call engineering, inspection, environmental and other miscellaneous engineering services, including staff augmentation to address work in relation to the South Napa Earthquake that occurred on August 24, 2014.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On September 19, 2014 the Purchasing Agent with delegated authority from the Board awarded a contract to WRECO for work related to South Napa County earthquake that occurred on August 24, 2014.

WRECO's team has been assisting the County with the various earthquake projects and the county requires ongoing support from WRECO's team on several of these earthquake related roads structure repair projects that are currently in review for funding approval and environmental clearance. The original contract will expire on June 30, 2017. Approval of Amendment No. 1 to Agreement No. AUD 6967 is necessary for WRECO's team to provide continuous engineering support for the earthquake projects.

funded projects are typically as follows: FHWA 88.53% and County

reserve funds for the 11.47% match. The projects are in various phases of

funding approval.
