# RECOMMENDATION

Sheriff requests approval of Budget Transfer No. 67 appropriating \$12,198 in the Sheriff's budget with offsetting revenue from Santa Clara Sheriff's Department. (4/5 vote required)

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Santa Clara County Sheriff's Department has provided funds for the purchase of forensic equipment to better ensure the registration, compliance monitoring and tracking of Megan's Law registrants within the County and as part of the SAFE Task Force. A budget transfer in the amount of \$12,198 is needed to increase appropriations for this allocation.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**

# BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Santa Clara County Sheriff's Department has formed a regional coalition known as the Sexual Assault Felony Enforcement (SAFE) Task Force to include local, state and federal law enforcement officials in proactively preventing sexual assault crimes and keep sexual assault offenders off the streets. Participants include the Counties of Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino, Lake, Napa, Sonoma, Solano, Marin, San Francisco, Contra Costa, San Mateo, Alameda, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Benito and Monterey.

The objectives of the SAFE Task Force are to:

- Monitor sex offenders who have a high propensity to commit another sexual assault crime;
- I Identify and apprehend sexual predators and track predators in the Megan's Law database;
- Assist other law enforcement agencies with sexual assault investigations; and
- Educate the community to recognize predatory behavior and know where to seek help.

Santa Clara County Sheriff's Department was allocated funds from the State of California Office of Emergency Services to coordinate the SAFE Task Force and allocate funds to the participating counties for the purchase of forensic equipment. Participating counties can coordinate and combine SAFE resources to periodically perform joint SAFE operations. Napa County was allocated \$12,198 from Santa Clara County.
