SUBJECT: Resolution temporarily closing a portion of Silverado Trail

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Public Works requests adoption of a resolution temporarily closing a portion of Silverado Trail from Brannan Avenue in Calistoga to Glass Mountain Road from 7:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. on Sunday, July 15, 2007 for the Napa Valley Inline Marathon and Half Marathon.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The organizers of the Napa Valley Inline Marathon and Half Marathon have requested a temporary closure of Silverado Trail from Brannan Street in Calistoga to Glass Mountain Road from 7 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. on Sunday, July 15, 2007 in order to hold this event. This is the identical closure used in the Napa Valley Inline Marathon since 2004.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The California Outdoor Rollerskating Association is promoting the Napa Valley Inline Marathon and Half Marathon on Sunday, July 15, 2007 from 7 AM to 10 AM. Participants will skate along a 6.55 mile closed portion of Silverado Trail between Brannan Avenue in Calistoga and Glass Mountain Road. Two laps are equal to 26.2 miles. This is the identical closure used in the Napa Valley Inline Marathon since 2004.

The course will begin and end at the Silver Rose Winery located on the Silverado Trail in Calistoga. Skaters will start near the intersection of Rosedale and Silverado Trail and skate southbound along the trail 6.55 miles to Glass Mountain Road, make a 180 degree turn and skate northbound along the Silverado Trail back to the Silver Rose Winery in Calistoga.

This event is estimated to attract 300 skaters and 100 spectators. The organizers have contracted with the California Highway Patrol (CHP) for traffic control. A certificate of insurance naming Napa County as additional insured is on file.

The following conditions are being required by Public Works to ensure adequate notification to the public and to provide a safe environment:

- All traffic control devices and personnel be in conformance with Caltrans' Traffic Manual.
- b. All properties having access to the portion of Silverado Trail being closed shall be notified prior to the event and access shall be provided to them during the event.
- c. Access shall be provided for emergency vehicles at all times.
- d. The California Outdoor Rollerskating Association shall contract with the CHP for traffic control services during the event.
- e. A certificate of insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 shall be provided to the County naming the County of Napa as additional insured.
- f. All costs of clean up and repairs to County facilities damaged as a result of this event shall be borne by the California Outdoor Rollerskating Association.
