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### **RECOMMENDATION**

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the renewal of Agreement No. 3580 with Queen of the Valley Hospital of Napa, California, through its CARE Network Program for a maximum of \$30,800 for the term July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007 to provide Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) services.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Approval of the requested action will renew the agreement with Queen of the Valley's CARE Network to provide housing services to Napa County residents with HIV or AIDS through June 30, 2007.

**ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

**BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

The Housing Opportunities for Persons With Aids (HOPWA) Program is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and administered by the California Department of Health Services, Office of AIDS. The HOPWA program was established by federal legislation in 1992 to prevent low-income persons with HIV disease or AIDS and their families from becoming homeless. Under this contract, assistance with short-term emergency rent, mortgage, and utility payments is available for eligible individuals.

The Agency has an executed Business Associate agreement on file with this provider.
