RECOMMENDATION

Director of Public Works requests approval of plans and specifications for the "Animal Shelter Standby Generator Project," PW 06-03, authorization to advertise for sealed bids and opening of the bids at at time, date and location to be published by the Director of Public Works pursuant to Section 20150.8 of the Public Contract Code.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Installation of a standby generator at the Animal Shelter is needed to maintain refrigeration, air conditioning, lighting and all other electrical essential services so as to have a functioning facility during power outages.

Discretionary Justification:	A generator is required to maintain power to the Animal Shelter facility. Currently when the Animal Shelter looses power, the refrigeration unit does not maintain the temperature needed to keep the animal carcasses cold until they are removed from the premises.

Future fiscal impact:	Maintenance of the generator and Bay Area Air Quality Management District

Consequences if not approved:	The installation of the generator at the Animal Shelter would be canceled.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

Categorical Exemption Class 1: It has been determined that this type of project does not have a significant effect on the environment and is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Animal Shelter facilities located at 942 Hartle Court periodically experience power outages. During these outages, the air conditioning system does not function, the freezer loses power and the temperature in the unit containing animal carcases becomes elevated; causing unacceptable odors to permeate the facility. The installation of the standby generator would provide the power needed at the facility during the power outages.

On November 11, 2005 the Board of Supervisors authorized an agreement with O'Mahony & Myer to provide design and construction assistance for consultant services for the installation of a standby generator. Preparation of plans and specifications has been completed and staff requests that plans and specifications be approved for the contract and that the Director of Public Works be authorized to set a bid opening date.

The project is budgeted at \$362,000. Construction is scheduled for the summer.
