## BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Napa County Advisory Board on Alcohol and Drug Programs is appointed by the Board of Supervisors to study and report on alcohol and drug issues and related programs. The Advisory Board is comprised of members of the community who are interested in alcohol and drug issues. In accordance with its bylaws, the Advisory Board will present its Fiscal Year 2005-2006 annual report to the Board of Supervisors. The report will be presented by Robert Howard, past Chair of the Advisory Board. The report highlights the accomplishments of the Advisory Board in Fiscal Year 2005-2006, which include:

- Recovery Happens Month in September 2005;
- Recruitment of new members; and
- Promoted public support for Detox and residential services which resulted in Project 90 Napa Valley opening in October 2005.

The Advisory Board will also report on goals for Fiscal Year 2006-2007, which include:

- Establishment of a relationship with local vintners to develop a unified platform;
- Continued site visits to local alcohol and drug programs and ancillary service providers;
- Tracking and monitoring of legislative issues which impact alcohol and drug programs; and
- Organization of local events to celebrate Recovery Happens Month in September 2006.

The Advisory Board will present recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on promoting access to alcohol and drug services to residents in American Canyon and upvalley communities, expanding prevention and treatment services to youth, promoting access to Spanish language treatment for youth and adults, and providing access to treatment to older adults.
