SUBJECT: Actions regarding the Regents of the University of California, on behalf of UC Davis Extension

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the following amendments to agreements with the Regents of the University of California on behalf of UC Davis Extension as follows:

- 1. Amendment No. 1 to Agreement No. 2131 increasing the amount by \$14,220 for a new maximum of \$103,095 to provide training to Comprehensive Services for Older Adults staff; and
- 2. Amendment No. 1 to Agreement No. 7420 increasing the amount by \$1,481 for a new maximum of \$10,369 to provide training to Child Welfare Services staff.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The University of California's extension campus at UC Davis has developed a training program that is offered to county Social Services and Child Welfare Services program staff. The objectives of this contract are to:

- Improve service delivery in the administration of Social Services programs
- Implement tactics designed to transition clients to self sufficiency
- Prepare for the impending changes with health care reform

Approval of the requested actions will increase the contract maximums for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 to enable UC Davis to provide staff with professional development training opportunities, specifically Mutual Learning through trainings provided by Carrie Hayes who is certified in Mutual Learning, with the goal of increased excellence in service delivery to clients.

The Regents of the University of California is not a local vendor. The County has contracted with the Regents of the

University of California for training sessions since 1983. These agreements terminate June 30, 2017.

Approval of the recommended action will enable the Regents of the University of California, on behalf of its UC Davis Extension, to provide the following training services to HHSA staff:

Amendment of Agreement No. 2131 (Comprehensive Services for Older Adults): The proposed amendment would increase the maximum contract amount to allow Comprehensive Services for Older Adults (CSOA) to extend training in the area of Mutual Learning. The use of this communication framework and mindset is an overarching agency objective to improve communication with internal and external partners and enhance the provision of services to clients. The additional funds for training will allow CSOA to train new staff and continue to train and support existing staff around the principles and application of Mutual Learning.

<u>Amendment of Agreement No. 7420 (Child Welfare Services)</u>: The proposed amendment will add a half-day of training regarding Introduction of Mutual Learning Behaviors to the Child Welfare Services Leadership Team.
