BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**Emergency Medical Care Committee Annual Report**

The Napa County Emergency Care Committee ("EMCC") is established by the Napa County Board of Supervisors to perform the functions set forth in (1) below as authorized by Sections 1797.270 through 1797.276 of the California Health and Safety Code relating to the provision of ambulance services, emergency medical care, and training programs in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and lifesaving first aid techniques within Napa County.

1. The EMCC shall perform the following functions:
 - a. Review, at least annually, all of the following:
 1. The operations of ambulance services operating within Napa County; and
 2. Emergency medical care offered within Napa County, including training in Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR).
 - b. Public Access Defibrillation (PAD).
 - c. First aid practices.
2. Report to the State Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Authority, the local Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency and the Board, at least annually, the observations and recommendations of the EMCC resulting from the EMCC's activities listed in (1) above.
3. Act in an advisory capacity to the Board and the local EMS Agency on all matters related to emergency medical services as directed and requested by the Board from time to time.

Michael Oliveri, Chair of the Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC), will present the EMCC's Annual Report to the Board.

Local Emergency Medical Services Annual Update

On July 1, 2017, the Public Health Division of the Napa County Health and Human Services Agency will be completing its sixth year as an independent County Local Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency, or LEMSA. Among the most significant highlights from the last year are:

1. Approval of all EMS Authority System Plans including plans focused on Trauma Services and Quality Improvement
2. Queen of the Valley Medical Center was re-designated as a Level III Trauma Center and they received verification by the American College of Surgeons at the same level
3. American Medical Response West (AMR) completed its fifth year of emergency and ALS ambulance transportation services on January 2, 2017 and has performed well above contractual response time requirements. AMR is substantially in compliance with its contract.
4. Napa County extended the contract with AMR for an additional five year period with services to be provided through 2021.

The attached combined EMCC and Emergency Medical Services Agency Annual presentation details these and other LEMSA activities over the past year.
