SUBJECT: Agreement with FOUTS Springs Youth Facility for placement of Napa County Wards

RECOMMENDATION

Chief Probation Officer requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the renewal of Agreement No. 4391 with County of Solano - Fouts Springs Youth Facility for the term July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006 to provide court ordered placement of wards at a monthly rate of \$3,500 per ward.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Fouts Springs Youth Facility is a detention facility created by joint powers agreement between Solano and Colusa Counties for the placement of male juveniles who are court ordered wards. This facility provides a highly structured program working with wards that would otherwise have gone to the California Youth Authority.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Fouts Springs has been operating continuously as a juvenile placement option for counties since 1959. It was created as a collaboration between Colusa, Placer and Solano Counties. Fouts Springs is currently administered under a joint powers agreement between Colusa and Solano Counties. For Fiscal Year 2005-06, the facility is improving its program to enhance educational and vocational opportunities for wards and to strengthen the reentry counseling component. In addition, to improve program quality the JPA agreed to transfer the management of Fouts Springs from a freestanding department in the Solano County structure, to a division of the Solano County Probation Department. Unfortunately, the facility was forced to close the female program during the current fiscal year due to budget restraints.

Currently, Napa County has three wards placed at the Fouts facility. The total cost of placements for Fiscal Year 2004-05 is estimated to be approximately \$110,000. The department averages three placements on a monthly basis. The price of a bed for FY 2005-06 represents a \$154 increase over FY 2004/05 from \$3,346 per month to \$3,500 per month. This increase is due to increased costs in operating the facility. It is anticipated that placements to camps will be reduced once the new Juvenile Justice Center is fully operational.
