SUBJECT:	Amendments to Agreements with Wine Valley Cab Company and Napa Valley Cab Company

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the following amendments decreasing the amounts by \$2,250 each for new maximums of \$1,500 each and incorporating agency-wide changes to the General Terms and Conditions to provide services to CalWORKs recipients for the Guaranteed Ride Home Program:

- 1. Amendment No. 2 to Agreement No. 4771 with Haydar Jabarin dba Wine Valley Yellow Cab Company; and
- 2. Amendment No. 2 to Agreement No. 4778 with Mohammad Abu-Hamdi dba Napa Valley Cab Company.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Wine Valley Yellow Cab Company and Napa Valley Cab Company provide transportation by taxi to participants in the CalWORKs Guaranteed Ride Home Program. These services are intended to be used for emergency situations only. The amendments reduce the contract maximums of both agreements to reflect the low level of usage anticipated for Fiscal Year 2005-2006. The amendments also incorporate agency-wide changes to the General Terms and Conditions.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The Guaranteed Ride Home Program was implemented in 2002 and is one of seven mobility strategies developed as a result of welfare-to-work transportation planning, facilitated by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. As many welfare-to-work participants do not own an operable vehicle, the use of public transportation or other alternative modes of transportation such as carpooling have been encouraged. To minimize the inconvenience of using such modes, the Guaranteed Ride Home was established to ensure that a welfare-to-work participant could get home or to a sick child in the event there was an emergency and these alternative modes were either not available or not suitable as emergency transportation. The sole purpose of the service is to transport welfare-to-work participants to or from work/training/school site; to child care locations; and to immediate family members in the event of an illness, injury, and/or severe crisis when their regular mode of transportation, such as the bus, is not available.

Because these agreements are used on an emergency basis only, the expenditures are minimal. The amendments reduce the contract maximums of both agreements to reflect the low level of usage anticipated for Fiscal Year 2005-2006.

Napa Valley Yellow Cab Company and Wine Valley Cab Company are not health care providers for purposes of HIPAA; there is no use or disclosure of protected health information by or to the vendors under this agreement.
