This proclamation recognizes Probation Officers and Juvenile Hall Counselors for their commitment and dedication to protecting the citizens of Napa County.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

During the week of July 15-21, 2012, people across the United States will join together to recognize the work that probation, parole and community supervision professionals do for our public safety. Since 1841, the practice of probation and parole has played a role in our justice system. These professionals are a critical part of the public safety system.

In Napa County, there are approximately 1,900 adults and 400 juveniles on probation. The Napa County Probation Department is responsible for providing supervision for all of these offenders some of whom may be on probation for more than one offense.
