RECOMMENDATION

Sheriff requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign the renewal of Revenue Agreement No. 170821B with the Napa County Office of Education for a maximum of \$123,212 for the school year term August 19, 2020 through June 16, 2021 to fund a Deputy Sheriff assigned to provide campus safety at the Juvenile Court and Community Schools.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This action will authorize the Sheriff's Office to accept revenue from the Napa County Office of Education for the placement of a Deputy Sheriff at the Juvenile Court & Community Schools located on Imola Avenue in the unincorporated area of Napa County during the 2020-2021 school year.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Napa County Office of Education is requesting to fund a Deputy Sheriff to act as a County Student Resource Officer assigned to provide campus safety at the Juvenile Court & Community Schools. The schools where services shall be provided include Chamberlain High School, Liberty High School, Creekside Middle School and Napa Community High School, all located on Imola Avenue in the unincorporated area of Napa County.

The goals of Napa County Office of Education in providing a Student Resource Officer are to create safe and drug free schools and to promote pro-social skills and healthy development in youth. The primary duties of the Deputy assigned as the Student Resource Officer include alcohol and other drug prevention, early intervention, violence prevention, the implementation of safe school policies and community partnerships.
