BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The primary function of the Grand Jury is to examine all areas of local government: county, city and special districts. The 19-member "civil" Grand Jury in Napa County conducts non-criminal investigations to ensure that government funds are judiciously used, that services are effectively delivered, and that all accounts are properly audited. The 2006-2007Grand Jury has issued a Final Report that includes the following County departments: Napa County Health & Human Services Child Welfare Services Department, Napa County Juvenile Detention Facility and the Napa County Jail. Responses to the Grand Jury findings are due to the Presiding Judge by September 26, 2007 and will be presented to the Board of Supervisors for approval no later than September 18, 2007.
