SUBJECT: Adoption of a Resolution amending the Table and Index increasing the biweekly compensation

of the Board of Supervisors

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Human Resources requests adoption of a resolution amending the Table and Index to reflect a salary increase for members of the Board of Supervisors of 0.1576% effective July 1, 2016 and an additional 4.23% effective July 1, 2017, as authorized by Napa County Ordinance No. 1263.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The salary of members of the Board of Supervisors is set by Ordinance No. 1263 to be equal to 47.09% of the salary received by judges of the Superior Court. On July 21, 2017, the County received notification that judges of the Superior Court will receive a salary increase of 0.1576% retroactive to July 1, 2016, and an additional 4.23% salary adjustment retroactive to July 1, 2017. Therefore, it is necessary to amend the Table and Index to reflect the appropriate salary increase for members of the Board of Supervisors. Section 2.100.270 of the Napa County Code provides that changes to the Table and Index shall be established by resolution. The Board of Supervisors last received a salary adjustment on July 1, 2016, reflecting the last salary adjustment received by judges of the Superior Court.

Future fiscal impact: The proposed retroactive increase effective July 1, 2016 will cost

approximately \$700. The proposed increase effective July 1, 2017 costs approximately \$19,900 annually and will be included in future budgets.

Consequences if not approved: County Ordinance No. 1263 requires that the salary of members of the Board

of Supervisors be set at 47.09% of the salary of judges of the Superior Court. The County received notification from the Judicial Council of California that the salary for judges of the Superior Court has been increased by 0.1576% retroactive to July 1, 2016 and an additional 4.23% effective July 1,

2017. Therefore, if this resolution is not adopted, the County would be in violation of the County Code, which mandates the increased compensation for

members of the Board of Supervisors.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On December 1, 1998, the Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No.1148 establishing the compensation to be paid to members of the Board of Supervisors. On June 15, 2005, the Board of Supervisors approved Ordinance No. 1263, which set the salary of members of the Board of Supervisors equal to 47.09% of the salary of judges of the Superior Court. Therefore, when the judges of the Superior Court receive a salary increase, members of the Board also receive the increase to maintain the 47.09% ratio. The Board of Supervisors last received a salary adjustment in July 2016 of 1.36%, reflecting the last salary adjustment received by the judges of the Superior Court.

On July 21, 2017, the County received notification that judges of the Superior Court received a 0.1576% salary adjustment retroactive to July 1, 2016, and an additional 4.23% salary adjustment retroactive to July 1, 2017. Therefore, it is necessary to amend the Table and Index to reflect the appropriate salary increase for members of the Board of Supervisors. Section 2.100.270 of the Napa County Code provides that changes to the Table and Index shall be established by resolution.

Therefore, the Director of Human Resources requests adoption of the attached resolution amending the Table and Index.
