EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

County Executive Officer requests the reappointment of nine incumbents whose terms have expired, to the Napa Valley Workforce Investment Board.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

There are currently sixteen (16) openings on the Napa Valley Workforce Investment Board (NVWIB) for which the County Executive Office advertised. Nine (9) openings are due to expiration of terms and seven (7) are vacant positions.

One incumbent representing Labor, whose term expired June 30, 2006, does not wish to seek reappointment. Nine of the current incumbents including Supervisor Wagenknecht have indicated their desire to be reappointed.

The NVWIB is a thirty-one (31) member, private sector led Board. The purpose of the NVWIB is to ensure the involvement of the business and industrial community, including small businesses, minority business enterprises, education, labor organizations, community-based organizations, economic development agencies and one-stop delivery system partners in workforce investment activities. The NVWIB also oversees a local cooperative relationship with the County that will most effectively satisfy the labor demand needs of the business community and enhance the economic well being of individuals in need of workforce investment services.

The County Executive Office will continue to advertise for the remaining eight (8) vacant positions as follows: two (2) Labor, one (1) Community Based Organization, one (1) Economic Development, and four (4) Private Sector Business.
