EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

There are currently sixteen (16) vacancies on Workforce Investment Board due to term expirations and two resignations. The County Executive Officer requests the above appointments/reappointments to the Workforce Investment Board.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Due to term expirations and two resignations there are currently sixteen (16) openings on the Workforce Investment Board (WIB). The County Executive Office has advertised for the vacancies and received three new applications and ten requests for reappointment.

The WIB is a thirty-one (31) member, private sector led board with representation from business, education, economic development, labor, community based organizations, and workforce development practitioners. The key functions of the WIB are: designing and overseeing Career Centers where unemployed persons can obtain assistance finding work; identifying schools and others who can provide job training; developing agreements with Career Center partner agencies to make sure there are adequate services available; developing a budget; establishing and monitoring local performance measures to ensure quality services are provided; coordinating employer services with job seeker services, promoting participation of private employers in the statewide workforce system; establishing a local "youth council"; and, attracting grant funding for youth activities.

The County Executive Office will continue to recruit for the remaining vacancies.
