SUBJECT: Adoption of a Resolution Amending the Departmental Allocation List for the District Attorney's

Office

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Human Resources and District Attorney request adoption of a resolution amending the Departmental Allocation List for the District Attorney's Office as follows to move positions from one budget division to another, effective July 1, 2017, with no net increase in full-time equivalents*:

- 1. Delete two 1.0 FTE Deputy District Attorney I/II/III;
- 2. Delete one 1.0 FTE Deputy District Attorney IV;
- 3. Delete one 1.0 FTE District Attorney Investigator;
- 4. Delete one 1.0 FTE Legal Secretary II;
- 5. Delete one 1.0 FTE Paralegal;
- 6. Add two 1.0 FTE Deputy District Attorney I/II/III;
- 7. Add one 1.0 FTE Deputy District Attorney IV;
- 8. Add one 1.0 FTE District Attorney Investigator;
- 9. Add one 1.0 FTE Legal Secretary II; and
- 10. Add one 1.0 FTE Paralegal.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Director of Human Resources and District Attorney recommend deleting six positions from the Consumer Fraud budget division and adding those six positions into the District Attorney's budget division. This is an administrative cleanup of the allocation list, necessary to finalize a reorganization of budget divisions approved in the Fiscal Year

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

In the FY 2017-2018 budget, the Board approved a consolidation of positions in two budget divisions in the District Attorney's Office. The funding for six positions in the Consumer Fraud budget unit was moved to the District Attorney's main operating budget through the FY 2017-2018 budget process. The requested action in this item amends the allocation list to move the six position allocations from the Consumer Fraud budget division to the District Attorney's main operating budget in the position allocation list, which is the final step necessary to enact this change.

Therefore, the Director of Human Resources and the District Attorney recommend the adoption of a resolution to amend the Departmental Allocation List as shown in Exhibit "A," effective July 1, 2017, with no net increase in full-time equivalents.
