## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Training and Employment Center receives funding to operate federal Workforce Investment Act programs through a subgrant recipient agreement with the California Employment Development Department. These subgrant recipient agreements take effect in April of each year and have a twenty-six month term during which the recipient may spend the funds. This action closes out the funding cycle ending June 30, 2004.

#### BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

This report accounts for and officially closes out the \$1,284,012.83 in funding that the Training and Employment

Center (TEC) received from the Employment Development Department/Workforce Investment Division to operate WIA Programs in Napa County for the period April 1, 2002 through June 30, 2004. WIA superseded the Job Training Partnership Act. Its programs offer a comprehensive range of workforce development activities, intended to promote an increase in the participants' employment and bring about an improvement in their job retention, earnings and occupational skills.
