### **RECOMMENDATION**

Director of Public Works requests the adoption of the following Resolutions:

1. Temporarily closing a portion of Berryessa-Knoxville Road from 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M. on Saturday, October 6, 2007 for the 4th annual "Tri Girl Tri Triathlon"; and
2. Temporarily closing a portion of Berryessa-Knoxville Road from 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M. on Sunday, October 7, 2007 for the inaugural "His Tri Triathlon."

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Enviro-Sports Productions, Inc. has requested a temporary closure of Berryessa-Knoxville Road from Putah Creek Resort north to Zim Zim Creek for the 4th annual "Tri Girl Tri Triathlon" scheduled for Saturday, October 6, 2007, and for Sunday, October 7, 2007, for the inaugural "His Tri Triathlon". Both temporary closures are requested to be from 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 noon.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

**BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

The 4th annual "Tri Girl Tri Triathlon" is scheduled to take place on Saturday, October 6, 2007, from 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M. Participants will swim a half-mile at Putah Creek Resort, followed by a 15-mile bicycle ride, and end with a 4-mile run along Berryessa-Knoxville Road. This event is anticipated to attract 500 participants and 100 spectators.

This year will also feature the inaugural all men's triathlon, "His Tri Triathlon" the following day, Sunday, October 7th. It is also scheduled from 9:00 A.M. to 12:30 P.M., which is identical to the "Tri Girl Tri Triathlon."

For public and participant safety the organizers have requested road closures to facilitate the running of the foot and bicycle portions of the events with the least amount of inconvenience to the public. All traffic control and road closures will be under the direction of the California Highway Patrol (CHP). The affected road is Berryessa-Knoxville from the Putah Creek Resort to approximately 9 miles north, ending at Zim Zim Creek. This portion of Berryessa-Knoxville Road serves the homes at the north end of Lake Berryessa and the public lands near Knoxville. The average daily traffic north of Pope Canyon Road is approximately 250 vehicles per day. Berryessa-Knoxville Road also provides secondary access to Morgan Valley in Lake County and eventually intersects Highway 29 at Lower Lake.

Public Works has received both the Insurance Certificate and the CHP Agreement for traffic control and the following conditions are being imposed to ensure a safe environment for the public:

All traffic control devices and personnel be in conformance with Caltrans' Traffic Manual.

- a. All properties having access to the portion of Berryessa-Knoxville Road being closed shall be notified prior to the events and access shall be provided to them during the events.
- b. Access shall be provided for emergency vehicles at all times.
- c. The organizers of the "Tri Girl Tri Triathlon" and "His Tri Triathlon" shall contract with the CHP for traffic control services during the events.
- d. A certificate of insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 shall be provided to the County naming the County of Napa as an additional insured.
- e. All costs of clean up and repairs to County facilities damaged as a result of these events shall be borne by Enviro-Sports Production, Inc.
