**SUBJECT:** Agreement with Granicus, Inc.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Chief Information Officer requests approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign an agreement (formerly No. AUD 5947) with Granicus Inc. for an annual maximum of \$17,814 for the term July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 with a provision for automatic renewal for the ongoing system management for the internet broadcasting of the public meetings.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Napa County originally entered into an agreement with Granicus Inc. on June 1, 2007 to provide training, installation, configuration and ongoing system maintenance, which relate to streaming media solutions and media management software access being used for County's internet broadcasting needs. Today's requested action continues the agreement with Granicus Inc. for ongoing system maintenance at \$1,400 a month and for maintenance related to mobile encoder at \$84.42 a month.

This technology allows residents to watch Board of Supervisors', Board of Equalization, Napa County Housing Authority, and various other district meetings online, live and archived, through the County's website. It provides public information, government transparency, and improved services to residents.

#### BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Napa County originally entered into an agreement with Granicus Inc. on June 1, 2007 to provide training, installation, configuration and ongoing system maintenance, which relate to streaming media solutions and media management software access being used for County's internet broadcasting needs. The requested action today is to continue the agreement with Granicus Inc. for ongoing system maintenance at \$1,400 a month and maintenance related to mobile encoder at \$84.42 a month.

Monthly managed services provide technical support for the system, remote monitoring of hardware and software to verify system is operating at optimum capacity, unlimited bandwidth for streaming content from the system and 12 months of archiving for all public meetings using the system. The mobile encoder is used by the Clerk of the Board when Board of Supervisors meetings are held at remote locations outside of the Board of Supervisors' room.

This technology allows residents to watch the Board of Supervisors', the Board of Equalization, Napa County Housing Authority, and various other district meetings online, live and archived, through the County's website. It provides public information, government transparency, and improved services to residents. All meeting videos contain relevant supporting documentation, like meeting agendas and minutes, allowing the public to stay well-informed on the decisions affecting their community.
