SUBJECT: Revenue Agreement with the California Department of Health Care Services (Performance)

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of and authorization for the Chairman to sign the renewal of Agreement No. 3315 with the California Department of Health Care Services for the term July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 setting forth the performance requirements the County must meet in providing mental health services to the community.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Approval of the requested action will renew the County's agreement with the Department of Health Care Services for the provision of an integrated and coordinated range of community mental health services appropriate to the needs of clients throughout Napa County. This agreement is required for Napa County to receive Federal/State funding necessary to maintain minimum required levels of mental health services in the community.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT**

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

#### BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Counties providing specialty mental health services under a managed Mental Health Plan contract with the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) must meet certain conditions and requirements to receive state and federal funding for these community mental health services. This Agreement, which is the County's performance contract, as required by Welfare and Institutions Code (W&I) sections 5650(a), 5847, and Title 9, California Code of Regulations (CCR), section 3310, sets forth conditions and requirements that County must meet in order to receive funding from the following sources: the Mental Health Services Act (State funds), Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH-Federal funds), Community Mental Health Services Block Grant (MHBG-Federal Funds) from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

This Agreement does not specifically cover federal financial participation or State general funds as they relate to Medi-Cal services provided through the Mental Health Plan "Managed Care" contracts but contains requirements that must be followed as one condition for receiving those funds.
