SUBJECT: Purchase of a fixed asset for the Public Health Department (Cisco Analog Phone Gateway)

RECOMMENDATION

Director of Health and Human Services requests approval of Budget Transfer No. 13 in the amount of \$6,005 transferring funds within the Public Health Budget budget to establish a fixed asset for the purchase of a Cisco Analog Phone Gateway to be used in the event of an emergency. (4/5 vote required)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This action will establish a fixed asset for the purchase of a Cisco Analog Phone Gateway for use by HHSA's Department's Emergency Operations Center.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The California Department of Health Services has allocated federal Centers for Disease Control (CDC) funds to Napa County to build infrastructure needed for public health preparedness in the event of a bioterrorism incident or other emergency. The funds may be used to purchase equipment for use in the Department's Emergency Operations Center (EOC). This phone gateway system will provide many outgoing and incoming lines with only one phone jack. It will save the department money since the alternative is to purchase several phone lines and pay a monthly service charge for lines each of the lines, lines which will only be used in an emergency.
