RECOMMENDATION

County Executive Officer requests discussion and possible action on the statewide propositions on the March 3, 2020 ballot.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

There is only one statewide proposition on the ballot on March 3, 2020. Staff is requesting discussion and possible action on Proposition 13, a proposition that would authorize \$15 billion in general obligation bonds for schools and college facilities, including \$9 billion for preschool and K-12 schools, and \$4 billion for universities, and \$2 billion for community colleges.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Proposition 13, a proposition on the March 3, 2020 ballot, would authorize \$15 billion in general obligation bonds for schools and college facilities, including \$9 billion for preschool and K-12 schools, and \$4 billion for universities, and \$2 billion for community colleges.

Because the County is not directly impacted by the proposed proposition, staff is recommending not taking any action at this point and monitor in case passage has direct or indirect pressures to the County budget in the future.
