RECOMMENDATION

County Executive Officer seeks discussion and possible action on AB 14 (Aguiar-Curry) regarding broadband deployment and access and funding.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

AB 1100 (Aguiar Curry) would, among other provisions, provide the authority to issue a revenue bond of up to \$1 billion; give explicit authority for Boards of Supervisors to approve the construction and operation of broadband infrastructure services.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Synopsis and Background

AB 1100 (Aguiar Curry) would do the following:

- Provides authority to issue a revenue bond of up to \$1 billion
- Give explicit authority for Boards of Supervisors to approve the construction and operation of broadband infrastructure services.
- Require the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz) to develop recommendations and a model for streamlined local land use approval and construction permit processes for projects related to broadband infrastructure deployment and connectivity and to post on its website as recommendations.
- Prioritizes last-mile infrastructure for unserved areas where internet connectivity is at or below 6 mbps, with a goal of achieving at least 100 mbps downstreams; upon the achievement of 98% of California households in each consortia region, this bill would require the commission to prioritize middle-mile infrastructure.
- Removes the "Right of First Refusal" service providers have. Currently, if a service provider can show that they are planning to expand service in an unserved area within 180 days, they can block an infrastructure grant from being awarded to a new service provider wishing to expand into that area.
- Other provisions, as specified.
