**SUBJECT:** AB 377 (Rivas) Water quality: impaired waters

## **RECOMMENDATION**

County Executive Officer, on behalf of the Director of Planning, Building, and Environmental Services (PBES), seeks discussion and possible action on AB 377 (Rivas) regarding water quality.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

AB 1100 (Rivas) would make significant changes to the water quality regulations and permitting processes, which could undermine local and regional control.

# **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

# Synopsis and Background

AB 377 (Rivas) -

- This bill would require all California surface waters to attain applicable beneficial uses by January 1, 2050.
- Require the state board and regional boards, when issuing an NPDES permit, a waste discharge requirement, or a waiver of a waste discharge requirement, to require that the discharge to surface water does not cause or contribute to an exceedance of an applicable water quality standard in receiving waters, and to not authorize the use of a best management practice permit term to authorize a discharge to surface water that causes or contributes to an exceedance of an applicable water quality standard in receiving waters
- The bill would prohibit, on or after January 1, 2030, a regional water quality control plan from including a schedule for implementation for achieving a water quality standard for a surface water of the state that was adopted as of January 1, 2021, and would prohibit a regional water quality control plan from including a schedule for implementation of a water quality standard for a surface water of the state that is adopted after January 1, 2021, unless specified conditions are met.
- The bill would prohibit an NPDES permit, waste discharge requirement, or waiver of a waste discharge requirement to discharge to a surface water of the state from being renewed, reissued, or modified to contain effluent limitations or conditions that, among other things, are less stringent than those in the previous permit, requirement, or waiver, except as specified.
