SB 581 (Atkins) - Concerns

Staff will provide an update on AB/SB 152 (Budget Committees), which is on the Board of Supervisors agenda on June 22 for possible action.

The Committee may direct staff to do one of the following after its review and discussion:

- (1) If the issue is in the State Platform, draft a letter and distribute it to the appropriate parties.
- (2) If the issue is not in the State Platform, direct staff to bring back the bill for further discussion and potential action.
- (3) Regardless of whether the issue is in the State Platform, direct staff to take the bill to the Board of Supervisors for potential action. Bills will be prioritized based on relevancy to the County and the Legislative Platform.
