County Executive Officer requests discussion and possible direction on an issue regarding county repayment of overpayments identified in an Office of Inspector General (OIG) Specialty Mental Health Services Audit.

Staff has identified significant concerns with the proposed efforts by the California Department of Health Care Services to recoup the entire amount of the determined overpayment of \$180.6 million from California's counties and will present these concerns in detail at the Legislative Subcommittee meeting.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The federal Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Office of Inspector General, issued a report in 2018 that concluded, based on a statewide audit, that California "claimed at least \$180.6 million in unallowable Federal reimbursement" because "its oversight was not effective in ensuring that its claims complied with Federal and State requirements." HHS, through its component the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), provides Federal Financial Participation to support Medicaid services, called "Medi-Cal" in California. CMS provides this funding pursuant to an approved State Plan to the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), which, as pertinent here, provides reimbursement to county mental health plans to assure that necessary specialty mental health services are provided to Medi-Cal beneficiaries. DHCS now attempts to recoup the entire amount of the determined overpayment of \$180.6 million (relating to services for fiscal year 2013-14) from California's counties.

Staff has identified significant concerns with the proposed efforts by DHCS to recoup the overpayment and will present these concerns in detail at the Legislative Subcommittee meeting.
