## RECOMMENDATION

Approve the project and concur with staff's determination that the project is Categorically Exempt for the 2019 Sanitary Sewer Manhole Adjustment Project (CIP 13702).

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This project will adjust to grade approximately 200 sanitary sewer manholes and approximately 30 sanitary sewer flush holes after completion of the City of Napa's annual paving projects. Based on the timing and sequencing of paving by the City of Napa, staff may divide the project into two separate phases/contracts. It is expected that all of the work will be completed by the end of this fiscal year.

Notice to Proceed is expected in September 2019 and construction completed by the end of June 2020. NapaSan staff will perform construction management and inspection of this project. The engineer's estimate of probable construction cost for the entire project is \$330,000.

Plans are available for review in the NapaSan's Administrative Office and will be available at the Board meeting on July 17, 2019.

Where is it budgeted? The item is budgeted in the capital budget with \$332,600 available in Fiscal

Discretionary Justification: This project is necessary for the District to have access to its facilities to clean

and maintain the collection system.

emergencies in areas that the City of Napa has paved.
