#### RECOMMENDATION

## LARGE VENUE RECYCLING GRANT.

REQUESTED ACTION: Approval of the following actions relating to the large venue recycling grant:

- 1. Acceptance of the grant in the amount of \$82,000 for large venue recycling; and
- 2. Approval of a budget transfer increasing appropriations for fiscal year 2005-2006 by \$60,000 with offsetting revenues. (4/5 vote required)

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Agency applied for and received a Department of Conservation grant for waste reduction at large venues and events. The Agency was one of 13 of the 29 proposals awarded. The grant is for \$82,000 and will span over 2 and 1/2 years, including at least 1 year of monitoring. The majority of the funds will purchase equipment in the first year to facilitate recycling at the four venues. Staff will coordinate with the City of Napa on this project. The City also received a grant for \$78,000.

Discretionary Justification:	This will increase recycling for the challenging area of large venues. Staff has struggled with these events over many years. Having the equipment to facilitate recycling has been a major impediment. This grant primarily purchases equipment which should remove that impediment.
Is the general fund affected?	No
Future fiscal impact:	The grant is for 2 and 1/2 years. The majority will be expended in 05-06. The remaining amounts will be included in the future budgets until grant funds are fully expended.
Consequences if not approved:	The activities will not been completed, while new state law requires jurisdictions to work on this topic.
