CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Staff to provide an update on the status of activities relevant to the Act.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Napa County Solid Waste Local Task Force (SWLTF) is continuing work on the 2007 Five Year Review of the Napa County Integrated Waste Management Plan and its associated elements.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

SB 1020, which would require communities to achieve a 75% diversion rate (instead of the 50% currently required

under AB 939) was working its way through Sacramento. This has now become a two year bill.

The CIWMB contacted UVA staff with concern that the waste volume numbers reported by UVDS to the Waste Board did not match the numbers reported to the Board of Equalization. This issue for the 2006 reports has been addressed to the satisfaction of the CIWMB staff. UVA and UVDS staff met recently to discuss not only this issue but future reporting requirements as well, which continue to be more complex and detailed. A followup meeting occurred this past week to meet the next reporting deadline (11/16/07). It is possible that the level of reporting required may getting to the level whereby UVDS needs to hire a fulltime person solely to keep the reporting on track.
