DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Staff to provide an update on the status of activities relevant to the Act.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Waste Reduction and Recycling Activities Update

Home Composting Workshops – Each year, UVWMA, Napa County, and the City of Napa, together with Napa County Master Gardeners, co-sponsor a home composting workshop program for local residents. The sponsors have scheduled a series of ten composting classes for 2012. Four workshops are scheduled for Saturdays at up-valley locations: on April 21 at Calistoga Community Center, August 18 at White Barn in St. Helena, September 8 at the Napa Museum, and September 29 (Sat.) at Yountville Community Center. Over 100 people attended the first workshop held in the City of Napa on March 10. See the registration form handout for a complete countywide list of workshops.

<u>Beverage Container Recycling Program</u> - The State recycling and waste agency, CalRecycle, each year disperses funds from its Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Program to cities and counties. Up-valley cities qualify for \$5,000. The County receives \$10,000. For over ten years, each Upper Valley Waste Management Agency (UVWMA) member jurisdiction has forwarded its share of these funds to UVWMA to support cooperative recycling efforts. The agency uses the \$25,000 for eligible beverage container recycling and litter reduction activities.

The \$25,000 in this year's budget is money received at the end of last fiscal year (i.e. because of delays in state payments the past several years we are spending money one year behind). CalRecycle has announced its plan to release FY 2011-12 funds this spring, meaning that we may actually have an additional \$25K (or a portion thereof) to spend this year. Of course, since the money is coming from the State we won't actually count on those funds until the check is received (and clears the bank).

<u>Up-valley Regular Drop-off Recycling and Waste Collections</u>

- Computers and Electronics Clover Flat Landfill daily, during business hours
- <u>Fluorescent Lamps</u> from households only Central Valley Builders Supply and Steve's Hardware in St. Helena; Calistoga Fire Station, Silverado Ace Hardware, Vallarta Market, and Clover Flat Landfill in Calistoga; Pope Valley Market; College Hardware in Angwin; La Luna Market in Rutherford; and Yountville Corp. Yard open during regular business hours
- Household Batteries from households only Napa Valley Coffee Roasting Company, Central Valley
 Builders Supply, and Steve's Hardware in St. Helena; Silverado Ace Hardware and Clover Flat Landfill in
 Calistoga; Town Hall in Yountville during regular business hours
- Household Hazardous Waste Collection event last held at Calistoga Fairgrounds Program is suspended
- Medications Disposal Up-valley residents can drop-off old or unwanted medications and used needles and lancets at Clinic Ole Offices – 661 Main St. in St. Helena; 911 Washington St. in Calistoga, during regular business hours
