SUBJECT: Second Amendment to Agreement 2011-02 Household Hazardous Waste Operations Agreement

RECOMMENDATION

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Approval of and authorization for the Chair to sign Amendment No. 2 to Agreement 2011-02 with 21st Century Environmental Management of California, LP to remove the disposal of latex and oil based paint (post consumer paint) from the Agreement and allow 21st Century Environmental Management to contract with PaintCare, Inc. for disposal of the waste paint.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The amendment removes the disposal of latex and oil-based paints from the agreement with 21st Century Environmental Management of California, LP and allows them to contract directly with PaintCare, Inc. for disposal of the paint. It relieves the Agency of the cost of disposing of the paint.

Discretionary Justification:	Approving the Amendment will eliminate the disposal cost for latex and oil-based paint, resulting in a significant ongoing savings to the Agency.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The proposed action is not a project as defined by 14 California Code of Regulations 15378 (State CEQA Guidelines) and therefore CEQA is not applicable.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The California Architectural Paint Recovery Program (Cal. Public Resources Code 48700-48706) requires paint manufacturers to create an architectural paint stewardship program that collects, transports, recycles and properly disposes of latex and oil-based paint (post-consumer paint). PaintCare, Inc. was created by the paint manufacturers to implement the program.

The Amendment removes the transportation, recycling, and disposal of latex and oil-based paint from Agreement 2011-02. It also allows 21st Century Environmental Management to contract directly with PaintCare, Inc. for transportation, recycling and disposal of the paint, resulting in a savings to the Agency of up to \$5,000 per year on the disposal cost for waste collected at the Town of Yountville's Corporation Yard and up to 40% of the waste disposal cost at temporary household hazardous waste collection events.
