EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The next up-valley workshop on landscape greenwaste composting will be held on Wed., Sept. 23 at Whiting Nursery in St. Helena at 6 p.m.

Small Grant Funding to Remain Stable in 2009-10

Despite conditions in Sacramento, it appears that there will be no changes in the up-coming fiscal year to the small grants that UVWMA benefits from. Each year, UVWMA shares \$25,000 in funds provided to its member agencies by the State Dept. of Conservation. UVWMA used these funds to purchase and distribute recycling bins to over 50 businesses in the past year and assisted schools with field trips, class activities, and waste reduction measures. It also helped sponsor and advertise earth day, Coastal Clean-up Day, Recycle America Day and other

events.

UVWMA also shares grant funds that the County receives annually from the CA Integrated Waste Management Board. The County uses these funds to pay for recycling drop-off sites for motor oil, filters, and bilge pads. This year County staff will continue to oversee operation of public drop-offs at Pacific Union College, Clover Flat Landfill, St. Helena Railroad Ave., Yountville Corp. Yard, and Steele Park Resort at Lake Berryessa.
