STRATEGIC PLANNING

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION:

- 1. Discussion and possible adoption of UVA Policy Number 3 (Landfill Upgrades), Policy Number 4 (Support of Local Facilities); and Policy No. 5 Organics Diversion),
- 2. Conduct Second Study Session on the Clover Flat Landfill and Resource Recovery Park (CFL).
- Consider appointment of an Ad Hoc committee to assist the Agency Manager in contract negotiations and authorize the Agency Manager to enter into a consulting contract, not to exceed \$10,000, should the need for one arise during contract negotiations.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of today's meeting is to discuss and review topics that have come out of the Board's previous discussions on Strategic Planning efforts.

The Board has previously requested the development of Policies on:

- Policy No. 1: Waste Diversion Goals (Complete)
- Policy No. 2: Climate Protection (Complete)
- Policy No. 3: Landfill Upgrades (Discussions today will inform this future policy)
- Policy No. 4: Local Facility Control (After Policy No. 3)
- Policy No. 5: Organics Diversion (After signature or veto of Organics Legislation on the Governor's desk)

The Board has adopted policies on the first two items above. The remaining policies are sequenced to other

events as discussed above and will be completed when those sequencing events are done.

In order to support development and adoption of policies for the third and fourth items listed above, Landfill Upgrades and Local Facility Control, the Board requested a series of meetings, in the form of a study session, to better understand the history, current status, and the future of CFL as it relates to UVA.

How will the landfill change between now and 2047? What it will look like when closed and capped? —this will be a visual "show and tell" while standing up on the hill;

Since we set the CPI base rate back in 2007, what improvements have done at CFL at the Company's expense:

Past and Current:

- 1. Landfill Gas Engine \$3M
- 2. Landfill Gas Engine \$3M
- 3. C&D Sort Line and Equipment 25% of 2.5M
- 4. Food Waste Composting \$0.5M
- 5. Wood Grinder \$0.5M

The Construction and Demolition debris facility, the "C&D Line"—where is it now, why it needs to move, where is it going

- 2. Drive to the C&D Line, then continue driving to the Front Gate:
 - See attached schematic drawing showing where the C&D line will go, and all the other proposed front gate improvements;
 - Cost estimate for moving the C&D line is \$1.5M, of which UVDS rate payers are responsible for 75%.
 - Cost estimate for the possible other improvements at the front gate is \$1.5M, including a building for the sorting area and an improved drop off area for the public (UVDS rate payers may be responsible for a part of this)
 - Review the other possible front gate improvements, and why they may be useful
- 3. If the Board is supportive of continued discussions, the Agency Manager requests the Board appoint a two person Ad Hoc committee to commence negotiations with the Company and authorize the Agency Manager to enter into a contract with a consultant (not to exceed \$10,000) should the committee determine that consulting help is needed.
