

#### Saturday October 21, 9AM-3PM Napa County Fairgrounds in Calistoga

Upper Valley Waste Management Agency will host a one-day hazardous waste collection at the Napa County Fairgrounds located at 1435 N. Oak Street in Calistoga on Saturday, October 21, from 9 am to 3 pm. A licensed hazardous waste handling company will accept a variety of hazardous wastes from local residents at no charge.

To be safe, residents should pack hazardous waste in the trunk or bed of their vehicle and transport it in amounts less than 15 gallons or 125 pounds per trip. The event is open to all up-valley residents who receive waste collection services or use Clover Flat Landfill, but is for households only.

Businesses that generate limited quantities of hazardous wastes will be able to dispose of them on Friday, October 20 from 1 pm to 4 pm. This collection event is open to only those businesses that generate less than 27 gallons or 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month. Appointments are required – call 1-800-984-9661 by 5 pm on Wednesday, October 18 to schedule a drop-off time. Businesses must pay disposal fees for hazardous wastes that they bring to this collection event.

### **Commercial Recycling** — **EASY, Good for Business...** and It's the Law!



YOU'VE HEARD THAT RECYCLING at your business can save energy and is good for the environment, but did you know that it's also required by state law? State law requires recycling at all commercial sites that generate four cubic yards or more of trash per week and multifamily residential dwelling of five units or more. The law (AB 341), passed in 2011, is increasing recycling and reducing greenhouse gas production throughout California.

With the passage of AB 1826 in 2014, new organic recycling requirements will be phased in over several years and will help the state meet its goal to recycle 75 percent of its waste by 2020. Businesses are required to recycle their organic waste on and after April 1, 2016, depending on the amount of waste they generate per week. Organic waste means food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste and nonhazardous wood waste.
